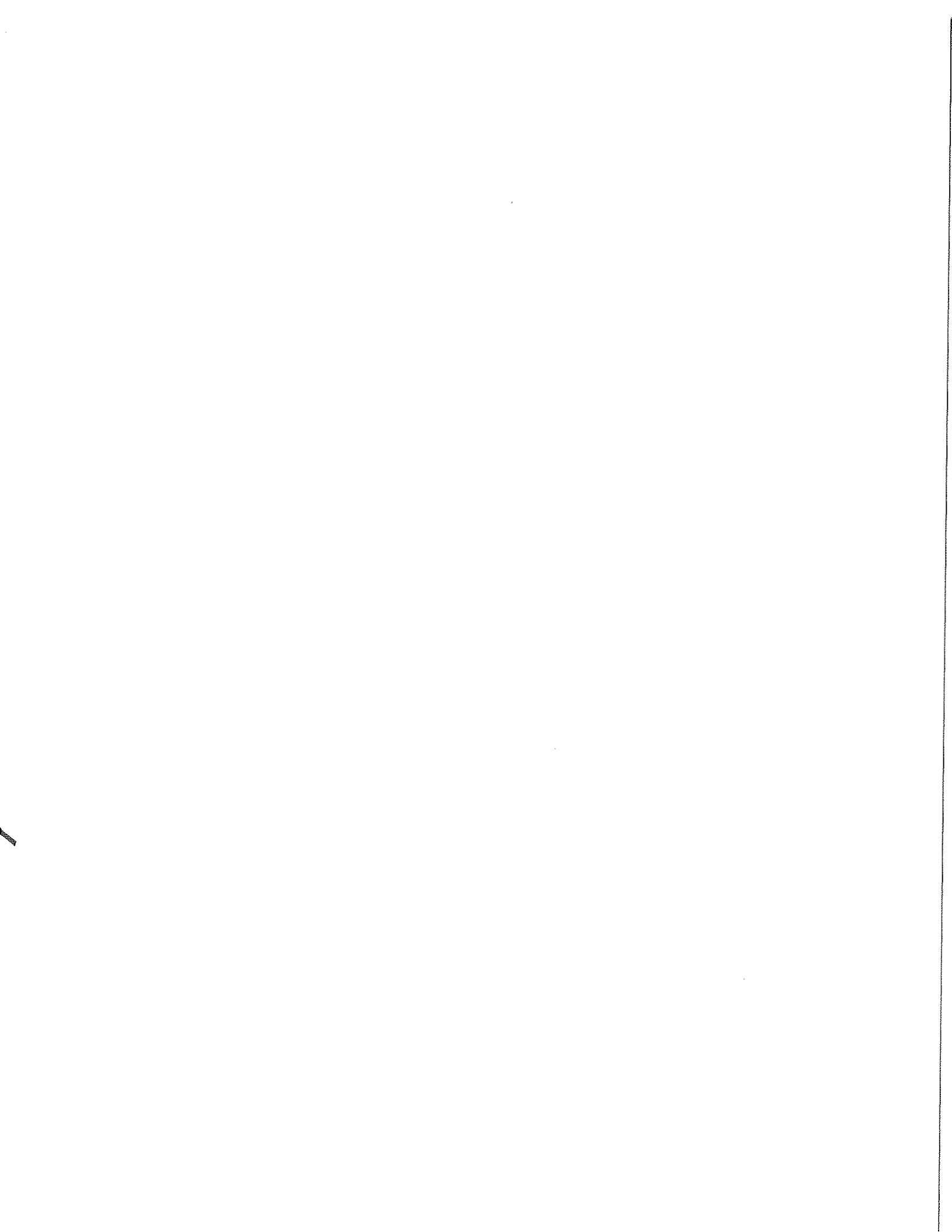
I am pleased to inform you that the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities has recently enhanced and expanded our Clean Energy Program incentives to aid residents, businesses and local government that sustained damage caused by Hurricane Sandy.

New Jersey's Clean Energy Program is a statewide program that offers financial incentives, programs and services for New Jersey residents, business owners and local governments to help them save energy, money and the environment.

We have extended our programs to include higher rebates on incentives for replacing residential appliances and commercial equipment. Additionally, we are waiving some requirements to help expedite our processes, to ensure participants receive our assistance as quickly as possible. Also, our programs offer financial assistance for gut-rehabs and new construction.

In response to Hurricane Sandy, the Clean Energy Program has also introduced a new suite of equipment replacement incentives for the food service industry. As many restaurants and food-related businesses were destroyed along the coast, we are encouraging business owners to think about energy efficiency and the money it saves in lower energy bills. Our new energy-efficient service equipment package can have long term energy savings when purchasing new equipment.

Rebuilding New Jersey is going to take time, but as residents, business owners and municipalities continue to get back up and running, we want to ensure that everyone is informed of financial assistance that is available. I encourage you to help us

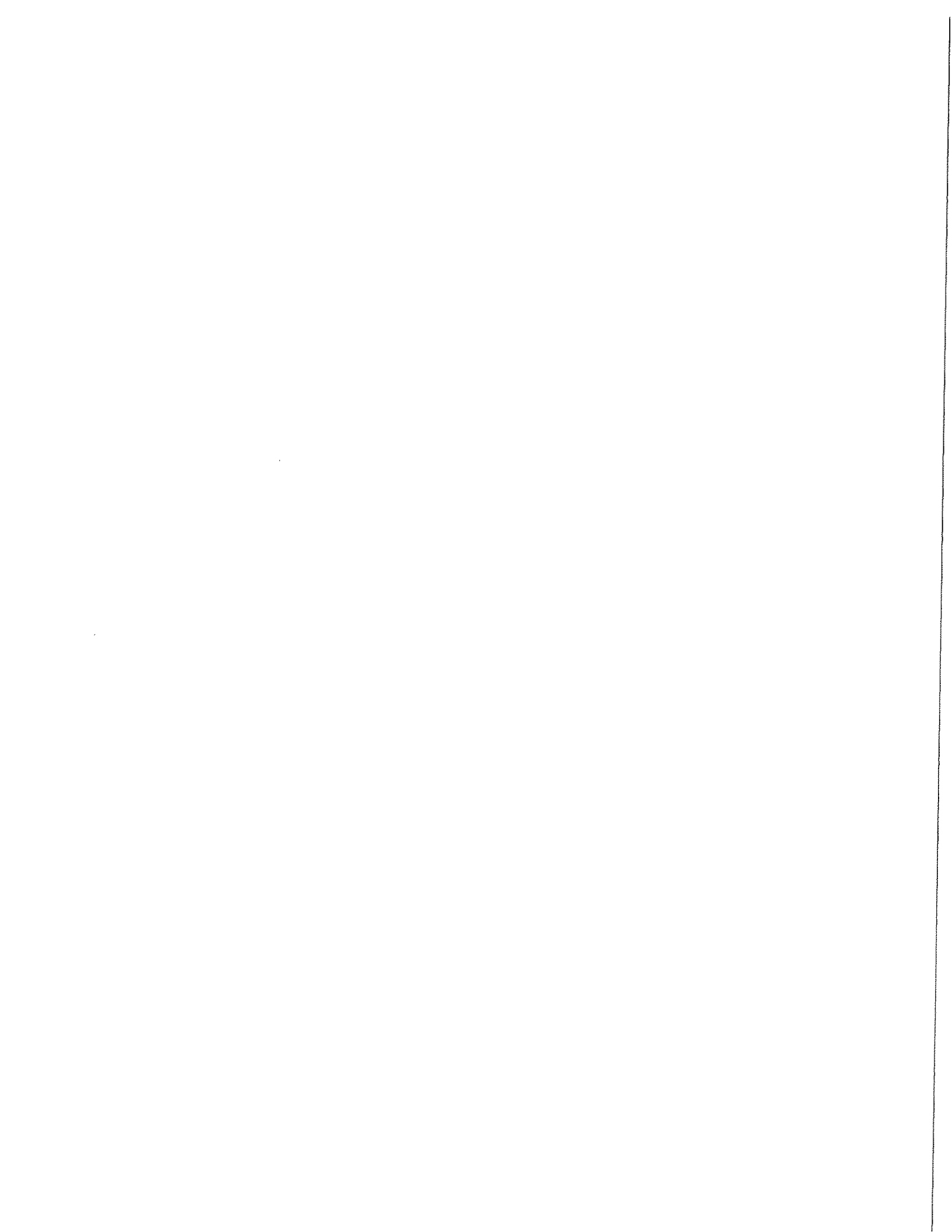
communicate to your residents and businesses that enhanced funding is available through New Jersey's Clean Energy Program. Additionally there are rebates for municipal governments.

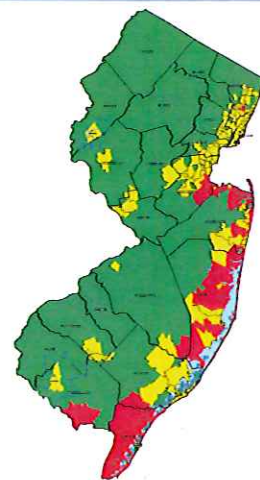

For a limited time, *New Jersey's Clean Energy Program* is offering a series of enhanced incentives to help you recover from the storm's impact.

HOMEOWNERS

If your home is located in a zip code designated as a damaged area impacted by the storm, you may be eligible for enhanced incentives in addition to current incentives on high efficiency equipment.* Qualifying equipment purchased on or after October 29, 2012, is eligible. Specific incentive information and eligibility criteria are available at NJCleanEnergy.com/SANDY while funding lasts. Increased incentives include:

- An additional \$200 per unit for qualifying boilers, furnaces, water heaters, heat pumps and ductless mini-split units.
- \$50 for ENERGY STAR[®] qualified clothes washers.
- Up to \$1,300 should you purchase both a qualifying furnace and water heater.
- \$500 for high efficient central air conditioning units.

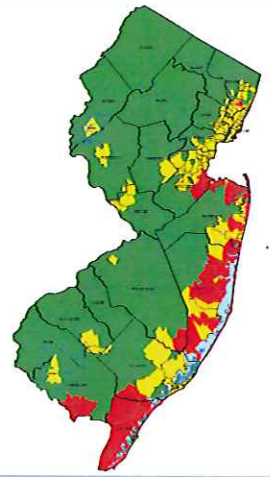

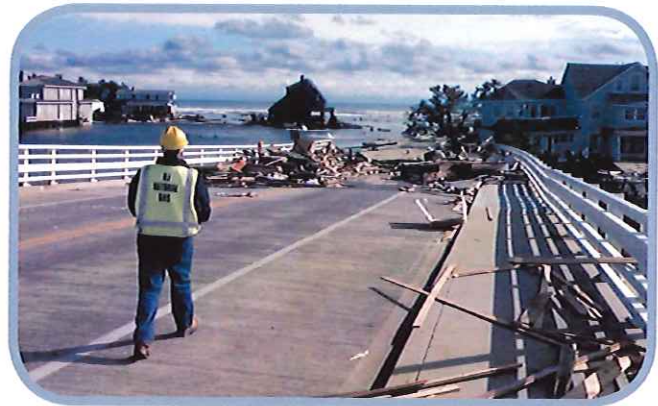

BUSINESSES AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS

Increased Financial Incentives

Incentives available through NJ SmartStart Buildings have been increased by 50% for those affected by Hurricane Sandy. Significantly reduce your costs when you upgrade to energy efficiency. Equipment purchased on or after October 29, 2012 is eligible while funding lasts. Smart Growth requirements are being waived for new construction projects in eligible areas impacted by Hurricane Sandy.



Streamlined and Modified Requirements

- Pre-inspections and pre-approvals will be waived where appropriate, as will equipment inventory requirements for those with proof of pre-existing conditions (i.e. maintenance records, recent photographs and energy audit reports).
- Restrictions on performance lighting measures in major rehabilitation projects have been eliminated.
- Planned discontinuation of incentives for premium motors and T12 lighting has been extended from March 1, 2013 to June 30, 2013.

Additional Incentives

To help get food providers back in business, we've also added incentives for qualifying high-efficiency food service equipment including:

- Dishwashers
- Fryers
- Griddles
- Hot Food Holding Cabinets
- Ice Machines
- Ovens
- Refrigerators & Freezers
- Steam Cookers
